

Cookies Policy

This Cookie Policy explains how we use cookies and similar technologies on our Website. It should be read together with our Privacy Policy, which explains how we process personal data more generally.

1. What are Cookies ?

Cookies are small text files placed on your device by websites you visit. They help the website function, improve the browsing experience, and provide certain information to the site owners. Cookies cannot access other data stored on your device or spread viruses.

2. Types of Cookies used on our Website

We only use the categories described below:

2.1. Strictly Necessary Cookies (no consent required)

These cookies are essential for the Website to function properly or to provide a service you explicitly request (e.g. submitting a contact form). Without them, the Website cannot operate as intended.

You cannot opt out of these cookies, but you can configure your browser to block all cookies (see section 5). If you do so, some parts of the Website may not function correctly.

2.2. Analytical cookies (consent required)

With your consent, our Website uses the functional cookies "ga", "gid" and "gat" from Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by the US company Google.

We use these cookies to track and obtain reports on how visitors use the Website. The lifespan of these cookies has been limited to 2 years for the "ga" cookies, 24 hours for the "gid" cookies, and 10 minutes for the "gat" cookies. Google may provide this information to third parties only if it is legally required to do so or if third parties process the information on Google's behalf. We have no influence over such disclosures. We have not authorised Google to use the analytical information obtained for other Google services. By default, we have enabled IP anonymisation for data sent to Google Analytics to protect your anonymity. The information is transferred to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google LLC is part of the organisations that comply with the new "Data Privacy Framework", which allows it to benefit from the European Commission's new adequacy decision of 10 July 2023 regarding the United States. This means that there is an adequate level of protection for the processing of personal data.

3. Enabling and Disabling Cookies – Withdrawal of Consent

During your first visit to our Website, a banner informs you of the presence of cookies and allows you to give your consent for the functional cookies listed above.

You may withdraw your consent at any time via the Website banner.



You can also configure your browser so that it does not accept cookies. This change must be made for each browser and on each computer. You can find more information on enabling, disabling, and deleting cookies by using the help function of your browser.
